### SIRS MEETING MINUTES February 8. 2025

After an hour of in-door flying, President Randy Doss called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. at St Mary's School gym. There were 19 members and two guests present.

Larry read the minutes from the January 11, 2025 meeting. Dennis read the Treasurer's report. Both reports were approved as given.

### **Old Business**

Randy stated that the AED system will be installed at the field in the spring along with training in its use. CPR training for Club members and possibly others, will also be provided. More details to follow in the next couple of months.

Larry stated the Z-mower recall had been addressed and the mower is back in the shed.

The local chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) is developing a week-long summer program aimed at promoting an interest in aviation among kids ages 11-14. The EAA has requested the assistance of SIRS in the building and providing of a flying site for an Old School Model Works, aka Goldberg Falcon Fifty-Six, which will be the focal point of the program. Two EAA members, Matt Kerner and Wayne Aldrich, were present at the meeting to explain their plans in more detail and to express thanks for SIRS participation. SIRS is being asked to provide experienced builders to teach up to 12 EAA members in the construction and the setting up of the first kit for flying, as there appears to be only one EAA member, Matt Kerner, who has any experience with RC. Matt was a SIRS member several years ago when the field was still at Thompsons. The training will begin mid-February and run a couple of evenings a week until the first kit is finished. The EAA members will assemble a second kit this summer with the kids. They hope to visit our field this summer for a "wheels up" experience with the kids! All SIRS members are encouraged to stop by the EAA hanger at the old airport Wednesdays and Thursdays from 5:00 to 7:00 pm to view the build progress.

The Australian F3A RC competition team that is participating in the F3A competition at Muncie this summer has requested practice privileges at our field in early August. Randy is checking into details such as insurance requirements, scheduling, etc.

The IMAC event to be held at our field this summer is a points-sanctioned event.

Dave Leavens stated work on the dirt track will commence soon, weather permitting.

### The EAA Build & Fly Program

The local chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA), Chapter 129, plans to host an Aviation Youth Camp this coming June--the Build & Fly Program. Among the activities planned for the week-long camp will be the building and then the flying of an RC airplane. The EAA has requested the help of SIRS to instruct EAA members this February and March in the building of an electrified Old School Model Works Fifty-Six balsa kit in the EAA hanger at the airport. Many older SIRS members will recognize the kit as an updated version of a Carl Goldberg Falcon 56. The completed plane will be used as a visual prop for the camp. If all goes according to plan, the EAA will build a second kit with the kids in June.

As we all know, there are many similarities between RC models and full-size planes, i.e., structural components, aerodynamics and fundamentals of flight. As part of the curriculum, the students will have access to a Realflight Evolution RC flight simulator, as well as simulators for full-size planes. The EAA has requested, and has been offered, SIRS instructors for the flights at our field. This program is a great opportunity for SIRS to step forward to gain some visibility in the community, and to give something back. Several SIRS members have already contributed time and talent to the project. Others are encouraged to stop out at the EAA hanger on Wednesdays and Thursdays from 5:00 to 7:00 pm and check things out.
